PSHE, Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) Consultation

From September 2021, it is a statutory requirement that all schools in England and Wales are teaching Relationship and Sex Education (RSE) as a fundamental part of the curriculum. This means that we will be reviewing our RSE curriculum and policy so we can be sure our provision is appropriate for our pupils based on their:

- Age
- Physical and emotional maturity
- Religious and cultural backgrounds
- Special Educational Needs

As part of implementing the RSE curriculum, schools must consult with the children, parents, staff and governors to ensure there is a general consensus on our approaches to policy and the curriculum content.

John Cabot Academy will be starting their consultation process on Monday 17th May 2021; the consultation will close on the Friday 21st May 2021.

As part of this, parents, staff and governors, will be asked to read through the following document:

Covid Guidance Update

From May 17, new guidance will come into effect for schools, in line with the Government's Covid-19 roadmap.

Secondary students will no longer be required to wear face coverings in classrooms or communal areas. However, if possible, we would like students to continue to bring a face covering to school as before, as there may be areas of the school in which they may be asked to wear them, where it is more difficult to stay apart. While the government no longer recommends the wearing of face coverings in the classroom, students may choose to wear them at any time during the day if they feel more comfortable doing so. Staff at JCA will also no longer be required to wear face coverings in classrooms. Staff and visitors will continue to wear masks outside the classroom in areas where social distancing is not possible (such as corridors and communal areas).

All of our current Health and Safety measures will remain in place from May 17 as follows:

- 1. Continue to follow guidance to test and self-isolate if you display symptoms and do not attend school;
- 2. Ensure face coverings are used in recommended circumstances;
- 3. Clean hands thoroughly and more often than usual;
- 4. Follow the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach;
- 5. We will maintain enhanced cleaning, including cleaning frequently touched surfaces often;
- 6. Maintain social distancing wherever possible and bubbles will continue;
- 7. Occupied spaces will continue to be well ventilated;

Friends of JCA - Our PTA - Looking for Volunteers

JCA has historically had a wonderful Parent Teacher Association, called the Friends of JCA. Its purpose is twofold: fundraising and information sharing.

By selling snacks, drinks and ice-creams at key events e.g. Sports Day, Parents' evenings and Concerts, significant sums of money were raised, almost £1000 alone each Sports Day. This also served a vital service - parents are usually desperate for a cup of tea during Parents' evening! Different departments were then able to bid for this money for things we would otherwise not be able to afford e.g. new musical instruments or supporting students to go on trips like Duke of Edinburg expeditions.

The other purpose of the 'Friends' is to support parents with access to information. At Primary school, it is easy for Parents to have a good understanding of everything that is going on at school. That is always much harder at Secondary school as students become more independent and have multiple teachers. So the Friends support you as parents by providing information (via Social Media) about e.g. upcoming events or where to go to have a question answered.

Joining the Friends of JCA is a great way of getting to know the school and supporting your child while they are here, and making your own friends too. I am reassured that with a team of 10 parents, it is a very easily manageable time commitment. What is my child learning?

Thank you to all parents and carers who complete the surveys after each Parents' evening, the feedback is really helpful. The last few surveys have showed that understanding what your child is learning is the area you most want more information on. We have two resources on our website:

- The curriculum plans for every year group for every term show the topics your child is learning: https://johncabotacademy.clf.uk/curriculum-statement/

I spoke to a few parents (thank you for your time) to understand what else you want to help you understand what your child is learning. One of the key areas you wanted to know was when are our students going to sit tests/assessments/exams and what are they expected to revise. There are always ongoing small, low stakes assessments in class, this is an element of good teaching. But the significant assessments for the remainder of this year are:

- Years 7-9: Monday 14th June to Friday 25th June. Assessments in every subject, based on work completed across Terms 5 and 6. The assessments will be both:
 - Online multiple choice questions (completed at home)
 - o In-class written tests
- Year 10: Monday 28th June to Friday 9th July. Exams in every subject, based on all GCSE work studied to date. These will be past GCSE papers, sat in the GCSE hall. The experience of taking mock exams under these conditions, but with low stakes (i.e. the results don't actually matter) is an essential part of preparing them for real GCSE exams in the summer.

The results of all of these assessments/exams will inform the teachers' assessed grades and will be sent home to you in reports at the end of term 6.







Virtual UK University & Apprenticeship Search Fair - May 26th

We are encouraging students to take part in the UK University & Apprenticeship Search Virtual Fair on Wednesday 26th May (12:00-18:00). This free event features a multitude of universities, colleges, and apprenticeship providers from around the UK, along with 10 interactive webinars and virtual campus tours. It is aimed at years 13, 12, 11, and 10 as well as parents. The event will provide your child with all the information they need to make informed decisions about their post-18 options.

Students and parents can chat directly with a mixture of Russell Group, red brick, and modern universities from around the UK to find out invaluable information about courses and life at university, and discover what admissions tutors are looking for in UCAS applications. Attendees can also speak to colleges, universities and local and national companies about their apprenticeship schemes.

10 interactive webinars will run throughout the day on a variety of university and apprenticeship topics, such as UCAS Personal Statements, Careers & Employability, Clearing, Student Finance, and Apprenticeships. There is also a special webinar to help support parents and teachers taking place at 17:00. The webinars are run by university and apprenticeship professionals who will also host Q&A sessions after the presentations. 








CLF Big Event Timeline

Year 11 Leaving Dates

After consultation across the CLF, I can confirm the arrangements for year 11 for the end of the year are as follows:

- Year 11 will remain in school until Friday 28th May. They will use lesson time in the
 last two weeks to complete the administration associated with Teacher Assessed
 Grades. They may also have the opportunity to learn some additional content (that
 will not be assessed) but 'completes' their GCSE courses and better prepares them
 for their onward study. Some students may be catching up on missed assessments.

Please do not forget to advise medical information/allergies or state 'None' as requested above as we require this information for the venue.

Overdue Library Books

At John Cabot Academy we are lucky to have a well-stocked library, but in order to maintain the high standard and variety of the books on offer, it is necessary for us to insist that loaned books are always returned for the enjoyment and benefit of all of our students. We are now running a system of distributing regular library loan statements to students so that they know exactly which library books on their account are currently overdue.

Students will receive up to 3 reminder statements prompting them to return their books or visit the library to arrange a renewal on books they are still reading. Students can access the library from Monday to Wednesday, at break, lunch and tutor times. If books remain unreturned after the 3rd reminder statement a book replacement fee will be added to your SCOPAY account.

Ultimately, however, we would much prefer to have books back in the library, and on return of overdue items to the library, replacement charges will be removed from your account.

Revision Guides for Year 10 Students

We will be placing another order with suppliers for Revision Guides at the end of the first week of Term 6. Revision Guides will therefore reappear on SCOPAY for Year 10 students this week. The deadline for orders is Wednesday 09/06/2021. Please note that late orders after the deadline cannot be accepted as it will delay the delivery of the guides.

Orders are only being taken via SCOPAY and so if you have not already set up your SCOPAY account please message JCAFinance@clf.uk to request a link code.

SCOPAY - Online Payment System - Preferred Method of Payment

SCOPAY is our preferred method of payment for all transactions when making payments to the academy.

This system allows you to make payments for trips, events, music tuition and learning resources plus your child's school lunch account can also be topped up using this system. The system can be used on a desktop computer or you can download the App to use on your mobile phone or tablet meaning that you can access your account at any time. If you have not already received a link code or require an additional link code(s) to enable another Parent/Carer to also set up a SCOPAY account and make payments for your child(ren), please send an email to JCAFinance@clf.uk

SCOPAY - Payments for School Lunches

Please remember to check if your child's School Lunch account requires topping up with funds to enable them to purchase food from the canteen.

Purchase of School Ties

The option to purchase a school tie for £6.00 via SCOPAY is available for every student and SCOPAY continues to be our preferred method of payment. If your child has lost their tie,









you can purchase a replacement via your SCOPAY account, and it will be available for collection by your child the following morning.

Alternatively, for ties only, a cash payment can be accepted – please send your correct payment of £6.00 in an envelope with their full name, year group and tutor group detailed. Please ask your child to collect their tie from the Finance Office.

The Finance Office is open to students every day before school and during break time.

Purchase of Calculators

The option to purchase a calculator from the academy continues to be available to all students via SCOPAY.

If you wish to purchase a calculator for your child, there are two types available and currently in stock: -

- Casio ClassWiz FX991EX Scientific Calculator @ £19.50 each, or
- Casio FX83GT Scientific Calculator @ £8.50 each

When you have made your SCOPAY purchase, your child will be able to collect their calculator from the Finance Office. The Finance Office is open to students every day before school and during break time.

Purchase of Memory Cards for GCSE Photography
