JCA Routines: Following Staff Instructions (Addressing Defiance)

In John Cabot we have 8 clear routines, which we follow so that everyone knows both what to expect and what is expected of them.

We do this because it helps students to feel safe and, if they feel safe, they feel able to learn. Sometimes, our students don't follow our instructions for the first time.

We follow this up in a structured way to give our young people the opportunity to get it right: We address the student (by name if we know them) and clearly state the request we are making:

"Here at JCA we....."

"This is a reasonable request. Are you choosing not to follow it?"

Most of our students make the right choice once given this opportunity, however, some are sent to our Separated Learning Room if they don't take this moment to reflect and make the right decision. Year teams work with students who need support in building their resilience to 'bounce back' when things have gone wrong for them; we are so proud to watch our students build these skills in social interactions.

Equality Mark and the JCA Motto

He came into JCA in July 2023, in order to meet with staff and students, establish our current practice and decide what we need to do this year in order to achieve the equality mark. This is a lovely description of our practice, from Josiah, as of July 2023:

I am encouraged to see there is a true desire fulfil the wider societal/cultural needs of very diverse school, as that is the most important tool we can use to get to where we want to be; intention."

During the 23-24 Academic year, we have 3 key actions to undertake in order to achieve the equality mark. These are below with timings for them to take place:

- 1. Micro-aggressions and the n-word Training for staff (October inset)
- 2. Review of Employment practices (term 2, ready for term 3 recruitment season)



- 3. Promotion of the JCA motto (Term 3 onwards)
 - a. Positive stories (Term 3 onwards)
 - b. Knowledge of different culture/religions (Each inset day throughout the year)

It is this third action that I am writing to you about today. Last year, staff and students together summarised the JCA <u>vision</u> and created our new motto: Empower yourself, Empower your community. We have been slowly 'drip feeding' this motto into our day to day work at JCA e.g. examples of students who have empowered our community are in assemblies, changing our logo and putting it onto the website and other communications. Attending on time every day also helps students form good habits which can stay with them throughout their education and on into the workplace




Harry Potter Competition


