

## JCA Routines - Uniform and Equipment Expectations

The start to Term 4 represents a great time to remind students and parents of uniform expectations. The table below provides guidance of our school uniform:

### Uniform

Tie*	JCA clip-on tie.		
Jumper*	Dark blue, V-neck, with blue piping at the neck.		
Trousers	Formal black tailored trousers with a crease, reaching to the ankle. Jeans and other fashion styles are not permitted.		
Shirt	White, long or short sleeve, buttoning to the neck to be worn with a tie.		
Tights	Black, grey or neutral.		
Socks	White, black, grey or neutral.		
Shorts	Black, tailored, loose fitting shorts (not denim or sports shorts).		
School shoes	Black, leather, substantial (not trainers, daps or boots). See guidance below on acceptable styles of shoe.		



#### PE kit

Students are allowed to wear PE kit to school on the day they have their PE lesson. We would like to



remind families that PE leggings should be navy blue and only worn on PE days. Students will be asked to change if they arrive in different coloured PE leggings.

We must also add that your child will be asked to change into school uniform if they arrive at school in PE kit on a non-PE day. The pastoral team will also contact home for students who come into school with incorrect uniform.

Belt	Plain black with a discreet plain buckle or clasp.
Hijabs & Head Scarves	White, black, blue or grey if worn.
Durags, Bonnets & Head wraps	White, black, blue or grey if worn.

#### **New Behaviour Process**

Following parental feedback, this term we have made some minor amendments to how we manage our behaviour events. Our Behaviour Policy is in the process of being updated and approved at Academy Council to reflect this.

As has been our practice for years, students are given a warning for poor behaviour. If they are given a second warning for failing to meet our expectations, they are referred to SLR (Separated Learning Room).



Whilst in SLR, students will complete Maths, Science and English work, linked to their curriculum.

In a new development this week, Parent(s) will be sent a text home between 2 and 3pm that day to advise them for every behaviour incident and that their child will need to attend a restorative conversation after school at 15:00 which will end by 15:15 that day with the member of staff that has recorded the incident.

Restoratives provide an opportunity for the student and staff to reflect on how their actions impacted on the incident, and to agree how they will work together to avoid further incidents in the future. In our recent Executive Student Council meeting, the students commented on how much they value those conversations in order to have a fresh start next lesson.

The full reason for a student's behaviour event can be viewed in MCAS (MyChildAtSchool) in real time on the behaviour tile. We ask that families view these events and have conversations with the students around academy expectations to support us in helping maintain standards during lessons and overall conduct around the Academy. We also encourage **all** students and parents to **report any behaviours of concern**. If you enjoy chess and would like to take part, come by the library to sign up and find out if you can be this year's champion.




#### World Book Day


