### JCA Routines - Punctuality to School and Lessons

JCA continues to be a leading school for student attendance across the CLF. Thank you for supporting your child in coming to school each day.

This week, we would like to remind families about their children being punctual to school and lessons each day.

The school gate opens at 8:20am, where students are greeted by our leadership and pastoral teams. Both teams are also available to support students if they need help with their organisation or any pastoral needs.

Your child should be outside their period 1 lesson by 8:40am. Students who arrive later than 8:45am (or more than 5 minutes late to any other lesson) will be placed in the SLR (separated learning room). Being on time limits disruptions to the learning of others and ensures students maximise their learning experiences with their subject teacher. Families are also now able to monitor attendance and punctuality to lessons via their child's MCAS account.

At John Cabot, we are aware that many boys or young men may not always reach out for support / to raise concerns. Below is a new resource from childline that supports parents / carers in identifying and supporting someone who may be being exhorted (including how to report any concerns).

Childline's new 'Behind the Screen' campaign, seeks to raise awareness of the sexually coerced extortion of boys and young men. In particular it seeks to address the extortion of nudes from this group via blackmail, in relation to nudes exchanged and then saved by the extorter.

All young people should be able to feel safe to seek support for whatever afflicts them. Childline seeks to provide that service, and to act as a conduit for advice and support. The campaign has specifically been designed for boys and young men, to let them know its ok to reach out and that a place for their concerns exists at Childline.
