JCA Routines: Fire and Lockdown Procedures

At JCA, we have well established procedures to ensure our students and staff are safe in the event of an unexpected event. We respond to the fire alarm with the same routine each time; we do this as, although actual danger is rare in schools, we know that known routines and practises helps our students feel safe and supported. We know our students still need to work on being silent as they move. Please support us by reminder your child of the following expectations:

Fire regulations: At JCA, the fire alarm is a continuous siren.

At the sound of a continuous alarm, staff and students will:

- exit classrooms, leaving the building by the nearest fire exit quickly and quietly.
- Should it not put staff at risk, staff will close (but not lock) windows and doors.
- Staff and students will walk in silence once they are by the Sports Hall car park (on the way down to the large astro) so they can hear all instructions for their safety.
- **Whilst in silence**, all staff and students move in an orderly fashion and assemble on the large astro, where they line up in their tutor groups.
- Students and staff with physical impairments and LSAs should meet on the hard court at the back of the dining hall unless other arrangements have been previously agreed. Whilst on the hardcourt, staff and students will be silent.
- All staff, students and visitors stand in silence until the Principal or designated representative gives permission to re-enter the building.

Attendance: Arriving at School on Time

Arriving at school on time is not only essential for the student's own learning, it encourages habits of good timekeeping and lessens any classroom disruption. Late arrival means pupils risk missing important information which can seriously disadvantage them.

Students can arrive from 8:20am.

- All students are expected to arrive onsite at school at 8:30am in good time for the start of the lessons at 8:40am.
- If a student arrives at school after 8:40am, they will be marked in the register as late.
- Morning registers close at 9:10am. Students arriving after this time will be marked as absent for the morning session.

Students who are more than 5 minutes late to arrive at lessons will be referred to the Separated Learning Room and will be required to attend a 15 minute restorative conversation at the end of the day.

Staff may ask to meet with parents/carers of students who arrive late to school, to discuss reasons for lateness and solutions to support them to attend on time.
