Ramadan starts on Wednesday 22nd March and many of our students will be demonstrating their self-restraint, commitment and faith by fasting during this time. To support our students, we have made two prayer rooms available during their break & lunchtimes: CG3 for our KS4 students and the 'old cafe' on the Street for our KS3 students. Both rooms have dividers so males and females can pray separately. We are not going to allow students to leave their lessons to pray, but the pray rooms will be available at the end of the day for students.

There is also a dedicated space, the library (open every day at social times), where other students will not be eating or drinking. We hope both of these arrangements allow our students to flourish both academically and socially during Ramadan.

We have in assemblies and tutor time last week been talking about Ramadan and these sessions have really demonstrated the respect we have within our diverse student community. Students have been keen both to ask questions and share their experiences and it has been a pleasure to be witness to these conversations.

A number of staff are going to undertake a day's fasting on Monday 27th March. The students from our Equalities Council and our Muslim staff are delighted that we are sharing this experience with them. Students have created small gift bags for staff that have dates and water and information on when and how they should break their fast. The meal that breaks fast is called lftar. Many Muslims observe lftar by eating three dates, just as the prophet Mohammed did when he broke his own fast with three dates and water.

For those students who wish to celebrate Eid with their families, a day's authorised absence will be granted. Please do let us know if advance if your child will be absent for this reason.

Anti-Bullying Workshop

Next Workshop: Friday March 24th, 10.45 - 11.45am

The anti-bullying working group is an initiative bringing together key staff, parent and students to maximize





the development of an anti-bullying culture within JCA. The group meets on a termly basis, and is open to any parents who would like to support the school in progressing its anti-bullying strategies.

In the first meeting of the year during term 2, the working group reviewed the bullying incidents from term 1, with parents and students able to raise issues of concern. Significant input from students attending the meeting gave parents a more detailed student perspective with this identifying the support that students are given within JCA, whilst also highlighting the continued challenges that some students face.

The 2nd meeting of the term, held during term 3 started with a summary of how issues raised at the first meeting had been followed up and addressed within the school. The meeting then focused on analysis of the findings of the student well-being survey that had been completed at the beginning of January. Students were able to give detailed feedback on some of the issues raised, with concerns about safety being limited to very specific areas. Issues with gender based slurs was highlighted as an ongoing concern, with a parent suggesting the development of a kindness programme within the school.

Friday's meeting will be a follow up to the term 3 meeting. The agenda is to again share statistics of the most recent bullying incidents, but then to spend the rest of the meeting hearing about the proposed introduction of student wellbeing buddies, and further discussion regarding additional actions to promote kindness.

I hope the above summary highlights how the working group is progressing practice within JCA, and I would encourage parents to attend even if you have not been involved to date.


