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JCA Routines: Corridors

Our community has made a very positive start to the first main week of the exam period- it's great to see everyone being mindful as they walk along corridors calmly, quietly and respectfully.

Over the next week, we will continue our focus on our corridor behaviours, ensuring that we are all safe, calm and respectful of each other at all times. Our staff are on doors welcoming students into lessons to support punctuality and registers. If your child is in the corridor in lesson time, they can expect to be spoken to by every member of staff they meet; unless your child has a toilet pass or time out card supplied by us, they will not be allowed out of lessons for any reason.

Attendance: Arriving to School on Time

Arriving at school on time is essential for the student's own learning, it encourages habits of good timekeeping and lessens any classroom disruption. Late arrival means pupils risk missing important information which can seriously disadvantage them.

Students can arrive from 8:20am.

- · All students are expected to arrive at school at 8:30am in good time for the start of lessons at 8:40am.
- · If a student arrives at school after 8:40am, they will be marked in the register as late.
- · Morning registers close at 9:10am. Students arriving after this time will be marked as absent for the morning session.

Students who are more than 5 minutes late to arrive at lessons will be referred to the Separated Learning Room and will be required to attend a 15 minute restorative conversation at the end of the day.

Staff may ask to meet with parents/carers of students who arrive late to school, to discuss reasons for lateness and solutions to support them to attend on time.







2024 Chess Tournament



NB – we have very limited violin seats in Bristol Youth Orchestra for this coming academic year. We are especially looking for students playing trombone, tuba, viola, cello, double bass and bassoon, so please send to these students in the first instance, but will still welcome applications for other instruments.

Bristol Youth Orchestra are the flagship youth orchestra in the South West with a strong cohort of 90 players each academic year. Playing regularly on the Bristol Beacon stage (at least twice per year), the orchestra rehearse weekly on Saturday mornings during term time. Applicants for Bristol Youth Orchestra must be playing
