## JCA Routines: Keeping Safe in our Community

#### Road Safety

Please be aware of roadworks for example at the end of the road, the layout has changed and can cause confusion and people are unsure of the right of way.

If you ride a bike or a scooter and you wear a helmet, please ensure the helmet fits properly. Look right, look left, look right again.

## Walking home

#### Awareness in the Community

On Friday 14th June 2024 at 15:15 2 year 10 pupils were walking from school towards Kingswood. After leaving school they walked through Pillingers Road, onto Forest Road and then turned right into Wood Road. A small silver car stopped and an unknown male spoke to the pupils through the driver's side window asking if they were on their way home and wanted a lift. The girls sensibly quickly left and went into a shop to seek help.

The pupils contacted the police and was given an incident number and the following advice if faced with similar circumstances in the future.

#### The advice given was;

- Try to remember as much detail as possible e.g. record it in a voice note, photo if possible;
- Make, model and colour of vehicle is useful along with the registration number. The last three digits are the most important to recall;
- Shout and / or run to a safe place e.g. busy shop as soon as possible;
- Call 999 immediately and provide with as much information as possible- location, car details, description of person, what was said or done.

#### Attendance: Important Reminder about Term Time Leave

Attending school every day helps children and young people maximise their learning and enjoy the benefits of their education. It really does make a difference. For that reason, the academy will not authorise any leave of absence in term time, unless satisfied the reason is exceptional.

We ask parents and carers to request permission in advance, and only if absolutely necessary. Any requests should be put in writing via the appropriate form (available online at <a href="https://johncabotacademy.clf.uk/our-academy/attendance/">https://johncabotacademy.clf.uk/our-academy/attendance/</a> or from the Attendance Officer and wherever possible with at least four weeks' notice. The parent or carer who the child normally lives with should make the application.

We also ask parents and carers not to make plans without discussing with the academy first, so that we can make good decisions together. Family emergencies also need careful consideration. It may not always be appropriate, or in the best interests of the child, to miss school for emergencies which are being dealt with by adult family members. Wherever possible, please try to make alternative arrangements for your child so they can still attend school.

It is really important that we know where children are, as we have a duty to ensure they are safe. If we don't know why a child is absent, we will follow our safeguarding procedures.

Parents/carers are reminded that unauthorised term time leave may result in a penalty notice or prosecution.
