Very often we invite visiting speakers, teachers and services to JCA to develop an engaging curriculum and platform for our young people to learn effectively from many voices. We do this regularly on safety days, in cover lessons and in our assemblies in particular. Next week, we will also be inviting many employers from the local area to JCA to met our Year 10s and Post 16 students as part of their work experience programme.

Please do take this opportunity to remind your child about how to be a good ambassador for their school; we listen carefully to all visiting adults and show we care by asking astute questions and/or interacting when asked. These are important skills as they consider the first impressions they give others both in school and in the world of work.

Thank you to all our super students who took part in Comic Con 2024 and made it such a fun event!



Eid





We were very honoured to have members of our Muslim community come into school to share a feast with us, and explain about Eid-al-Adha.

Eid al-Adha, also known as the "Festival of Sacrifice," is one of the most important Islamic holidays. It commemorates the willingness of the Prophet Ibrahim (Abraham in Judeo-Christian traditions) to sacrifice his son Isma'il (Ishmael) as an act of obedience to God. According to Islamic tradition, God intervened and provided a sheep to sacrifice instead.

Muslims celebrate Eid al-Adha by performing a special prayer, followed by the ritual sacrifice of an animal such as a sheep, goat, cow, or camel. This act symbolises Ibrahim's willingness to sacrifice his son and God's




mercy in providing a substitute. The meat from the sacrificed animal is distributed among family, friends, and the less fortunate, ensuring that everyone can partake in the celebration.

Eid al-Adha occurs on the 10th day of Dhu al-Hijjah, the last month of the Islamic lunar calendar, and coincides with the culmination of the Hajj pilgrimage in Mecca, Saudi Arabia. The holiday emphasises themes of sacrifice, charity, and community.
