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1. Purpose

The Academy believes learning at home and elsewhere outside of the lesson is an essential part of ensuring strong knowledge acquisition and consolidation of in-class learning.

Homework should seek to consolidate classwork and encourage students to develop broader learning skills, including the habits of inquiry and investigation, independence, self-reliance and resilience.

Research shows that retrieval practice (on which a lot of our homework is based) helps with long term memory.

Whilst homework promotes parental/carer awareness and involvement, the work should be largely unaided, as the rationale behind setting the work is to develop a routine whereby the child independently settles down to a task, ultimately to develop a positive and constructive work ethic at home.

In addition to the set tasks, a minimum of fifteen minutes of reading is encouraged each evening.

2. Principles

The principles behind which homework will be designed and set are:

- Consistency: every student can expect one piece of homework in every subject, every week
- Relevance and purpose: homework is linked to the curriculum
- Communication: clear instructions, success criteria, deadlines

3. Responsibilities

Students:

- To attempt every piece of homework and meet the deadline
- To catch up on any homework set when they were absent from a lesson
- To ask for help with any problems (subject content or logistical)

Teachers

- To set homework
- To ensure homework tasks are communicated to students
- To be prepared to discuss and comment on homework completion at parents'/carers' evenings
- To recognise exceptional effort on homework
- To support all students to complete homework

Tutors

- To support students who are struggling with completing homework or meeting deadlines through helping with their organisation and seeking of subject help as needed

Parents/carers

- To support their children with their homework
- To check Show My Homework where homework will be recorded
- To ensure that students complete their homework before any recreational activities
- To offer regular breaks - ensure that students are hydrated, and eating and sleeping sensibly
- Where possible, to allow them supervised access to a computer. For support with a computer, contact your child's tutor in the first instance.
