



Student Friendly SEND Policy

A student has Special Educational Needs (SEN) if they have a **learning difficulty or disability** which calls for a special educational provision to be made, in addition to what is provided for their peers. Special educational needs and disabilities **(SEND) can affect a student's ability to learn**.

What would happen if you were struggling to access learning:

- Our teachers plan their lessons to a high standard to meet a wide range of needs in their classes (Quality First Teaching). Some students require more support than others, so the teacher will adapt their teaching to meet the needs. If a student seems to require more support than 'usual', the teacher will make the Pastoral team aware of this. At this point, the teacher and the Pastoral team will help & support with possible strategies in consultation with the SENCo (where required), check this help is working. The extra support means you can start to make progress and gets back 'on track'.
- Despite this help if you are still struggling we will contact your parent/carers to discuss. Further assessments may be completed and then through this may put in further support for you. At this stage we will discuss with parents/ carers putting you on our SEN register. The extra support may include interventions both in and outside school.
- If you need further bespoke support we may involve the help of Educational Psychologist, Speech and Language Therapist, Physiotherapist, or another specialist this will be discussed with your parents/carers.
