## are assessed...

GCSEs are assessed at the end of the two years.
The only exceptions to this rule are:
Art and Photography - Coursework 60\% and timed practical assessment 40\%

Drama - Coursework 60\% and Exam 40\%
Music - Coursework 60\% and Exam 40\%
Coursework is completed across the two years

40\% exam

60\% controlled assessment

40\% exam
Controlled assessments are completed in Year 10 and Year 11

$\square$ Choose a subject because you think it will be good for your career choice but you don't enjoy it

Do:
$\checkmark$ Choose subjects you enjoy
$\checkmark$ Choose subjects you have an aptitude for
$\checkmark$ Choose subjects which you enjoy and are good at and/or will be useful for future college and career choices
